



Police Explorer Programs

Exploring is a young adult career education program of learning for life for both young men and women who are between 14 through 20 years of age. Law Enforcement Exploring is a youth development program centered on law enforcement careers. Law Enforcement Explorers might choose to take part in crime prevention activities, community policing, traffic control, fingerprinting, ride-alongs, patrol procedures and connecting activities with high schools, court systems and national state and local academies. Law Enforcement Exploring is an action-oriented, hands-on career discovery program. Exploring is a division of the Boy Scouts of America.

Nationally, over 33,000 Explorers and 8,425 adult volunteers participate in Law Enforcement Exploring. The program highlights include: the National Law Enforcement Exploring Leadership Academies, career achievement awards, National Law Enforcement Exploring Conferences, and scholarship opportunities.

Typically, participants must:

- Be 14-20 years of age
- Attending high school or college & maintain a "C" or better grade average
- Have good moral character
- Have no serious driving infractions or criminal record
- Demonstrate a willingness to serve others
- Attend a weekly meeting and occasional weekend department or community service events
